The ideal candidate will be a self-starter with demonstrated analytical and problem solving skills, professional demeanor, and ability to exercise sound judgment; will have excellent interpersonal and communication skills, both oral and written; and excellent organizational skills, including ability to manage multiple high impact projects and priorities within strict deadlines in a fast paced environment.

The position provides technical support and process evaluation and improvement to the staff and operations of the Bankruptcy Court. The incumbent reports to and assists the Information Systems Manager in the design and implementation of automated information management

### Representative Duties

The Programmer Analyst will perform the full range of tasks and activities involved in developing, supporting and administering the court's web-based software applications for the court's Intranet and Internet websites. The developer will be involved in the full project development lifecycle, including user requirement analysis, logical/physical design and development, quality assurance testing, training and implementation. The incumbent will participate in or oversee software development or system upgrade activities and projects that provide web-based systems responsive to the needs of the court and the website's users and will be responsible for responding to any software-related problems or issues.

The successful candidate will have a minimum of 3 years hands on network experience to include system development experience.

### Preferred Qualifications

- Expertise in programming structures, languages, testing, and documentation techniques.
- Ability to develop and support web applications developed in HTML5, CSS3.0 and XML that will run on Apache and Tomcat7 servers.
- Ability to use development tools to code and debug applications.
- Skill in writing and analyzing SQL queries in MySQL and Informix database for custom reporting.
- Experience with CVS, Java Server Faces, Java Persistence Architecture, Hibernate and Web Services, IBM Web Sphere Portal, SAP business Objects for custom reports and Adobe HTML for PDF generation.

- Completion of a Computer Science Bachelor's Degree.

### **Employee Benefits**

The United States Bankruptcy Court is part of the Judicial Branch of the United States Government.
