Subject: The Credit Abuse Resistance Education (CARE) program – Volunteers Needed

The Credit Abuse Resistance Education (CARE) program is the court’s community outreach program that has promoted financial literacy education to San Diego County high school students and other young adults for nearly a decade.

Our CARE Program presentation by CARE committee members consists of a 45-minute PowerPoint program offered without charge to local high school and college classes regularly throughout the year, as well as to other financially vulnerable groups such as the elderly and foster youths. Consisting of local volunteers, the CARE committee is chaired by Hon. Margaret M. Mann. Judge Mann is also the Court sponsor of the program. The committee planning meetings are held in January, May and August of every year.

The CARE committee currently is seeking additional volunteers to join the committee. This is a great opportunity to use your skill set to help the community and to get to know the others on the committee. No special training is required, as the program is self-explanatory for experienced practitioners. If you would like to make a difference in the community without undue effort, this is your chance. Volunteers are asked to commit to giving at least two presentations annually and to attend at least one lunch planning meeting via Zoom. Helping to improve and update the program also is welcome.
