The United States Bankruptcy Court for the Southern District of California having determined that:

1. The Weinberger Courthouse would benefit from historic displays depicting the history related to the judges who chambered in the Jacob Weinberger U.S. Courthouse and the cases decided there;
2. That a failure to begin this process may result in the loss of important historical information; and
3. That the San Diego community would benefit from a public display of this information.

IT IS ORDERED:

- (1) A committee is appointed to undertake this project and, in particular, to prepare a proposal for funding, to research issues, and to initiate creation of historical displays. The initial members are Judge Laura S. Taylor, Christin A. Batt, and Robert R. Barnes.
- (2) The initial term of the committee members is two years.
- (3) The committee may be expanded as necessary by order of the court and the terms of the existing members may be extended by such an order.
